and the Christmas evening brings us to our beds
with grateful thoughts,
Forgiving and forgiven, for Jesus' sake. Amen*

Stevenson was so right. Christmas should be a remembrance of that long ago birth and all the miraculous circumstances that were a part of it. It should reach beyond the externals and refocus on how it all began. Someone observed that without **Christ** there would be no Christ-mas. He is truly the “Reason for the Season.” The gift of His coming brings change, joy, gratefulness and forgiveness.
