## ST. VINCENT DE PAUL SOCIETY

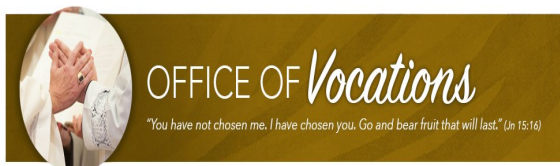

## St. Vincent de Paul Annual Report for Year Ending September 2018

The Society of St. Vincent de Paul, a Catholic lay organization, invites women and men to join together to grow spiritually by offering person-to-person service to those who are needy and suffering in the tradition of its founder, Blessed Frederic Ozanam, and patron, St. Vincent de Paul. St. Anne's Conference consists of ten (16) active members and eleven (4) associate members who meet twice a month to pray and to plan their work. Food is distributed from the Joachim Center food pantry every Saturday between 9am and 11am. The Society also provides emergency financial assistance, usually to individuals or families facing eviction or termination of utilities. Financial assistance is provided to local area residents only after thorough interviews have been conducted through home visits.

This year our conference received:

Your St. Anne Conference was responsible for approximately 300 telephone contacts and 198 home visits. Our members spent approximately 1,447 hours and logged approximately 1,100 miles in the course of these services. Our food pantry was staffed by a minimum of three volunteers every Saturday throughout the year. We currently have 3 rotating pantry crews comprised of members and volunteers.

During the year we have been blessed with new members, but unfortunately, some have seen the need to resign. Anyone who feels God is calling them to service in this worthy mission of charity, please contact one of our officers or members or just come to one of our meetings which are held every 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Thursday of each month at 6:15 in the Joachim Center. Check the Church bulletin for any changes.

The Society of St. Vincent de Paul welcomes all forms of involvement. You may be an "active member" participating in daily work. You may be a "contributing member" willing to help us in our work by donations, by volunteering in our food pantry or helping with monthly food deliveries from the Mid South Food Bank, and we never underestimate the power of your prayers.
